

**Research for Educational Change** Jill Adler, Anna Sfard, 2016-06-17 Research for Educational Change presents ways in which educational research can fulfil its commitments to educational practice Focussing its discussion within the context of mathematics education it argues that while research generated insights can have beneficial effects on learning and teaching the question of how these effects are to be generated and sustained is far from evident The question of how to turn research into educational improvement is discussed here in the context of learning and teaching hindered by poverty and social injustice In the first part of the book four teams of researchers use different methodologies while analysing the same corpus of data collected in a South African mathematics classroom In the second part each of these teams makes a specific proposal about what can be done and how so that its research generated insights have a tangible beneficial impact on what is happening in mathematical classrooms Combining two discourses that of researchers speaking to one another and that of researchers communicating their insights to those responsible for educational practice the book deals with the perennial question of communication between those who study educational processes and those who are directly responsible for teacher education educational research and classroom practices This book will be key reading for postgraduates researchers and academics in education and particularly in the areas of mathematics education education research teacher education and classroom practice It will also appeal to teacher educators practitioners and undergraduate students interested in educational research

responsive supports that are accessible welcoming and validating must be put in place at the institutional level and appeal to the talent motivation and unique needs of historically marginalized students In doing so postsecondary institutions will be better positioned to fulfill their promise as an equitable pathway to bachelor s degrees and beyond

**Effectiveness of teachers' guides in the Global South** Benjamin Piper, Yasmin Sitabkhan, Jessica Mejia, Kellie Betts, 2018-05-10 This report presents the results of RTI International Education s study on teachers guides across 13 countries and 19 projects Using quantitative and qualitative methods we examine how teachers guides across the projects differ and find substantial variation in the design and structure of the documents We develop a scripting index so that the scripting levels of the guides can be compared across projects The impact results of the programs that use teachers guides show significant impacts on learning outcomes associated with approximately an additional half year of learning showing that structured teachers guides contribute to improved learning outcomes During observations we find that teachers make a variety of changes in their classroom instruction from how the guides are written showing that the utilization of structured teachers guides do not create robotic teachers unable to use their own professional skills to teach children

Unfortunately many changes that teachers make reduce the amount of group work and interactivity that was described in the guides suggesting that programs should encourage teachers to more heavily utilize the instructional routines designed in the guide The report includes a set of research based guidelines that material developers can use to develop teachers guides that will support effective instructional practices and help improve learning outcomes The key takeaway from the report is that structured teachers guides improve learning outcomes but that overly scripted teachers guides are somewhat less effective than simplified teachers guides that give specific guidance to the teacher but are not written word for word for each lesson in the guide
