READING ROLES

1. Everyone picks a job. Remember, EVERYONE helps read the text and answer questions. The time keeper keeps the group focused the whole time.
2. The reading guide picks the way the group is reading and picks the readers.
3. The expert decoder listens while everyone reads and helps with tricky words.
4. The question master asks the questions for the day.
5. The group recorder writes answers and picks people to write each answer.
6. The fact checker makes sure all answers are correct BEFORE writing them down.
7. If you finish early, double check your work before moving on to your next job.

FACT CHECKER
My job is to make sure everyone's answers are correct before we move on.

EXPERT DECODER
If someone is having trouble with a word, my job is to help try to decode the word.

TIME KEEPER
My job is to make sure everyone is working the whole time and staying focused. If they stop working, I will kindly remind them.

GROUP RECORDER
My job is to write down everyone's answers to the questions.

QUESTION MASTER
My job is to ask the questions and choose the order we read.

READING GUIDE
My job is to pick how our group is going to read today's text, to pick who reads what.
